Mike's 69 and Colby's 77 seem good enough to get a little closer to the win, but adding a little scratch to their VGSC winnings isn't the worst thing that could have happened.

In the second flight there was a three-way tie for first place at net 57's. The team of Hill/Payne shot 80 and 81 gross and if both were NCGA members they might have been one the qualifiers. Love to see them play well and get some gift card money to buy Cervone some drinks. The other two teams in the first-place tie were the teams of Stanton/Stanton and Jacks/Williams. Doug was beeming at the opportunity to play with his daughter Natalie and his game was on full display shooting a 75.
